New NeSIS Initiatives

The NeSIS Team has been discussing three new initiatives that will begin in 2024.

Dynamic Duos:

Over the years, the NeSIS team has developed relationships with the campuses through campus visits and attending campus NeSIS meetings. This has helped us get an idea of what is going on and what challenges each campus could be facing. COVID and other factors have impacted these interactions in the past few years. In an effort to rebuild these connections between NeSIS and campus staff, pairings of NeSIS functional and technical staff would be created to meet informally with campus functional areas. These interactions would be informal meetings either in person or via Zoom and would help identify pain points, answer general questions and see if there are any new projects coming up. Having multiple perspectives in the conversation could identify issues or provide solutions and help build relationships between groups. PeopleTools Upgrade/Enhancement Implementation Strategy

As you know, the PeopleTools upgrades that we apply every other year or so include fixes to existing issues and security updates, but they also include new features or changes to existing features. These new features sometimes take a lot of time to evaluate to determine their impact, and then possibly development time to ensure that they work with our system. There can also be a significant amount of time required to test these new features, update documentation and communicate the changes to users. In the past, this has sometimes required a lot of time to make features work, or it's meant that some features may not have ever been implemented due to these time constraints or for other reasons.

Going forward, the NeSIS Team will form a PT evaluation team to evaluate the features in each PeopleTools upgrade and determine which ones we have to include with the upgrade and only those will be included. Other new features will be evaluated and prioritized and included with PUM updates throughout the year. This should help reduce the development and testing load of each PeopleTools upgrade and will give us time to get a better understanding of these features and the impact they may have. The features that will be included in each PT upgrade and PUM update will be communicated so they can be thoroughly tested and the campuses should have time to update any documentation and communications necessary.

NeSIS Database APIs

NeSIS is working on extending options for campuses to retrieve data. One of those options being explored are Standard APIs that could be utilized by all campuses. Another option is Self Service Query APIs that could facilitate limited integrations without requiring the existing traditional CR process. We're also looking into API solutions for larger, high volume data requests. The draft graphic on the next page has more information on the options identified so far. These ideas are still in initial stages, so more information will be given as it is available.





Change Request Status December 2023




Campus Development (35.5%) In Testing (7.1%) In Development (1.78%) Not Started (55.62%)
